## **CAT Wheels**

The Cat Wheels Bike Program is a Parking & Transportation Services initiative designed to provide a free bicycle loan system for all PBC faculty, staff and students. These bikes provide environmentally -friendly

transportation for running errands, off-site meetings or just a fun way to unwind now that the weather will be cooling down. Bikes can be checked out from PBC Parking and Transportation, through the work order system, bike must be returned to the original check-out location.

We have 2 single speed "cruiser" type bikes available. All bikes have hand brakes and come with a u-lock. To use a bike for free, simply bring your PBC ID to CM&O office. The first time you check out a bike, the staff will ask you to read and sign a liability form. Return your bike no later than 4pm on the following business day to the location from which you checked it out.

## Safety Tip: Preventing slips, trips & falls



- Keep your work space clean, don't clutter aisles or stairs. Store materials and tools properly.

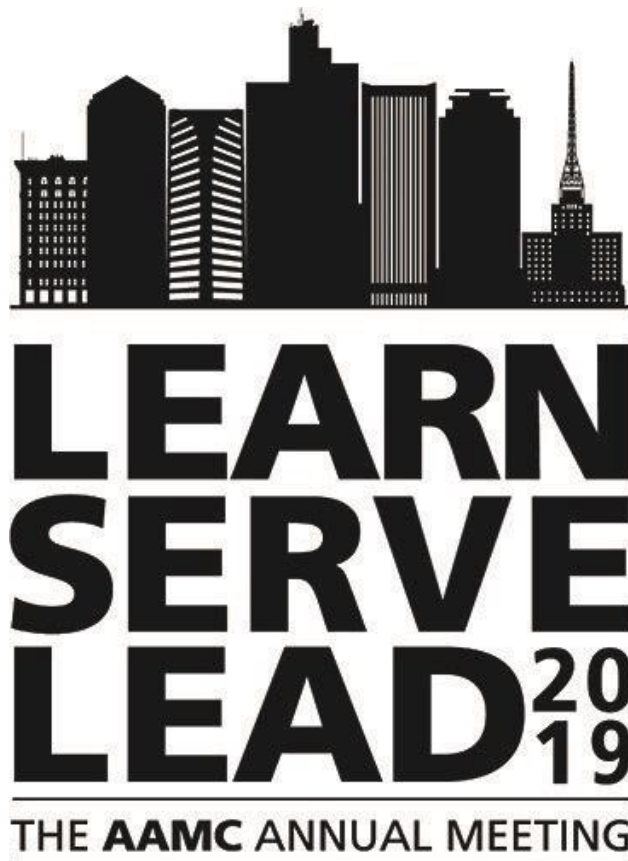
